The **Somalia Transition Initiatives for Stabilization Plus (TIS+) Project** contributes to stability by reducing the conditions that allow al-Shabaab to thrive by supporting participatory processes that promote good governance and community cohesion.

WHAT WE DO



Encourage inclusive processes that allow communities to contribute meaningful inputs to development priorities, local governance, and security arrangements.



Foster inter-community dialogues and support conflict mitigation processes, which reduce the community fault lines that are often exacerbated and exploited by al-Shabaab to retain influence.



Support local government officials to sustainably expand government presence in vulnerable areas through community outreach and strategic communications campaigns, targeted development projects such as solar streetlights, or rehabilitation of important community nfrastructure such as markets and local government buildings.



Undertake targeted quick response atmospheric and in-depth contextual analysis research to understand community conflict dynamics, key stakeholder groups, and perceptions of al-Shabaab and the government. Contextual analysis is used to identify current or emerging flashpoints and inform the planning and execution of stabilization efforts throughout TIS+'s engagement with a community.
