DT Global supports the implementation of the Australia Indonesia Partnership for Justice Phase 3 (AIPJ3). AIPJ3 is a five-year program funded by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) to work in partnership with the Government of Indonesia (GOI) to support advancement of its priority law and justice reforms and contribute to the overall goal of “Strong and accessible justice and security institutions uphold the rule of law and contribute to stability and prosperity in Indonesia and the region”.

AIPJ3 has the following end-of-program outcomes (EOPOs):

- EOPO 1: Justice institutions develop and implement policies, plans, budgets and practices that advance the rule of law and economic development in the priority areas of accountability and transparency, criminal and commercial law reform
- EOPO 2: Justice institutions and partners implement and adapt policies, plans, budgets and practices that contribute to preventing violent extremism and addressing transnational crime
- EOPO 3: Justice institutions develop and implement policies, plans, budgets and practices that advance equal access to justice for women, children and persons with disabilities
- EOPO 4: Government of Indonesia, Government of Australia and non-government organisations deepen partnerships in the justice and security sectors for mutual benefit.

Under Access to Justice Strategy (EOPO 3), AIPJ3 aims to strengthen the handling of marriage dispensation applications to improve access to justice and child protection in Indonesia. Judges often have limited information about a child's family circumstances, health, education, protection risks, and support needs, making it difficult to comprehensively assess the child's best interests. To address this, the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection/Kementerian Pemberdayaan Perempuan dan Perlindungan Anak (KPPPA), with support from AIPJ3, developed a draft Guideline for the Preparation of Child Protection Reports (Laporan Perlindungan Anak/LPA). Following consultations with KPPPA and key stakeholders, the draft documents require further refinement to improve their practicality, implementation arrangements, and consistent application by Pusat Pembelajaran Keluarga (PUSPAGA).

AIPJ3 is seeking a qualified Subcontractor to provide technical expertise to refine the LPA, develop an implementation mechanism and Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for its use within PUSPAGA, strengthen referral arrangements with relevant services, and prepare a practical handbook to support its effective implementation.

Interested organizations are invited to submit their technical and financial proposals along with all supporting documentation specified in this Request for Proposal, no later than **16 August 2026 at 23:59 Jakarta time (GMT +7)**.

VALUE ADDED TAX (VAT) EXEMPTION

The Australia-Indonesia Partnership is a form of technical cooperation between the Government of Australia and the Government of the Republic of Indonesia, established under the General Agreement on Development Cooperation (GADC) and subsequently formalised through Presidential Decree (Keputusan Presiden) of the Republic of Indonesia No. 54 of 1999.

In accordance with the Regulation of the Minister of Finance of the Republic of Indonesia (PMK) No. 59 Year 2024, certain transactions related to programs or activities funded by foreign or domestic grants (hibah luar negeri / dalam negeri) are eligible for tax exemption. Terms of Reference Strengthen the Child Protection Assessment Report for Marriage Dispensation Cases

A. Background

The Australia Indonesia Partnership for Justice Phase 3 (AIPJ3) is a five-year, A\$63 million investment by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) to work in partnership with the Government of Indonesia (GOI) to support advancement of its priority law and justice reforms. Building on previous phases, AIPJ3 will support partners to deliver activities against agreed policy priorities, while maintaining flexibility to respond to emerging needs and opportunities. The program focuses on seven policy priorities that are important to Australia and Indonesia: accountability and transparency, criminal justice reform, preventing violent extremism, transnational crime cooperation, commercial law, access to justice, and women's leadership.

Strengthening the handling of marriage dispensation applications is a key component of AIPJ3's efforts to improve access to justice and child protection in Indonesia. Marriage dispensation proceedings have significant implications for children's protection and future wellbeing. In practice, judges often have limited information about a child's circumstances, including their family situation, physical and mental health, educational continuity, protection risks, and support service needs when examining and deciding marriage dispensation applications. This can limit the court's ability to comprehensively assess the best interests of the child.

To strengthen child protection in these proceedings, the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection (KPPPA), with support from the Australia–Indonesia Partnership for Justice Phase 2 (AIPJ2), developed a draft Guideline for the Preparation of Child Protection Reports in Marriage Dispensation Applications, including a Child Protection Report (Laporan Perlindungan Anak/LPA) template. The LPA is intended to provide judges with comprehensive information to support informed decision-making. However, following consultations with KPPPA and other key stakeholders, the draft guideline and LPA require further refinement to improve their practicality, strengthen implementation arrangements, and better support their consistent use by Pusat Pembelajaran Keluarga (PUSPAGA).

AIPJ3, in partnership with KPPPA, seeks a qualified Subcontractor to provide technical expertise to refine the LPA, develop an implementation mechanism and Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for its use within PUSPAGA, strengthen referral arrangements with relevant services, and prepare a practical handbook to support its effective implementation.

B. The Objective of the Service

The consultancy aims to strengthen child protection in marriage dispensation proceedings by improving the quality of the LPA and supporting its effective implementation within PUSPAGA. Specifically, the consultancy seeks to:

- a. Improve the quality and practicality of the LPA to better support child-centred decision-making in marriage dispensation cases.



- b. Establish a clear and consistent process for the preparing and implementing the LPA within PUSPAGA, including coordination and referral arrangements with relevant stakeholders.
- c. Strengthen the capacity of PUSPAGA personnel to prepare and use the LPA effectively and consistently.
- d. Promote a more coordinated and standardised approach to child protection assessments in marriage dispensation proceedings.

C. Expected Outcomes

By the end of the consultancy, the following outcomes are expected:

- a. A strengthened LPA that is practical, comprehensive, and fit for use in marriage dispensation proceedings.
- b. A clear and standardised process for preparing and implementing the LPA within PUSPAGA, including defined coordination and referral arrangements with relevant stakeholders.
- c. Improved capacity of PUSPAGA personnel to prepare and apply the LPA consistently and effectively.
- d. More consistent and comprehensive child protection assessments to support judges in making decisions that uphold the best interests of the child.

D. Scope of Work

The scope of work for the selected organization will work closely with AIPJ3 and the KPPPA throughout the consultancy. The team will be responsible for:

- a. Reviewing the existing LPA and related materials.
- b. Participating in and providing technical inputs to consultations and validation workshops organised by AIPJ3 and KPPPA, including consultations with PUSPAGA, Courts and other relevant stakeholders to gather technical inputs and feedback.
- c. Refining and strengthening the LPA, incorporating stakeholder feedback, and supporting its practical implementation.
- d. Developing practical implementation tools, including a working mechanism, coordination and referral SOP, and user handbook for PUSPAGA.
- e. Presenting draft outputs, responding to technical feedback, and finalising all agreed deliverables.
- f. Providing regular progress updates and ensuring all outputs are delivered on time and meet the agreed quality standards

- a. Minimum bachelor's degree in psychology, Social Work, Public Policy, Law, or another relevant discipline.
- b. Demonstrated experience in child protection, family services, child-centred assessment, or case management.



- c. Experience developing child protection guidelines, assessment tools, implementation mechanisms, or technical guidance materials is highly desirable.
- d. Strong understanding of the best interests of the child principle and referral mechanisms for children and families.

3. Legal and Policy Specialist

- a. Minimum bachelor's degree in law.
- b. Demonstrated knowledge of Indonesia's legal and policy framework on child protection, marriage dispensation, family law, and judicial processes.
- c. Experience developing or reviewing legal and policy instruments, guidelines, SOPs, or other technical documents for government institutions.
